City of Grinnell Public Measure SI

SHALL THE FOLLOWING PUBLIC MEASURE BE ADOPTED?

Summary: To authorize imposition (renewal) of a local sales and services tax in the City of Grinnell that will continue without repeal of the existing local sales and services tax at the rate of one percent (1%) to be effective on July 1, 2027, until repealed.

A local sales and services tax shall be imposed (renewed) in the City of Grinnell that will continue without repeal of the existing local sales and services tax at the rate of one percent (1%) to be effective on July 1, 2027, until repealed.

Revenues from the sales and services tax are to be allocated as follows:

0% for property tax relief.

The specific purpose for which the revenues shall otherwise be expended is:

Fifty percent (50%) for the design, construction, repair, reconstruction, operation, and maintenance of city public infrastructure including, but not limited to, the water system, the sanitary sewer system, streets, storm sewers, and sidewalks; and

Fifty percent (50%) for parks, recreation, public safety, community development, or any lawful purpose as determined by the City Council.
