SHALL THE FOLLOWING PUBLIC MEASURE BE ADOPTED?

Summary: To authorize imposition of a **local sales and services tax** in the City of Searsboro, lowa at the rate of one percent (1%) to be effective from July 1, 2027 until repealed.

A local sales and services tax shall be imposed in the City of Searsboro, Iowa at the rate of one percent (1%) to be effective from July 1, 2027 until repealed.

Revenues from the sales and services tax shall be allocated as follows:

0% for property tax relief
